- Swimming Canada Warm-up Competition Safety Procedures will be in effect at this competition. [LINK](#)
- Current Swimming Canada Masters Rules will apply except as specifically modified in this meet package - [Rules](#)
- World Para Swimming Rules and Regulations will apply except as modified in this meet package for Para swimmers – [Rules](#)
- All participants in this event are reminded that they are bound by Swimming Canada's and Swim Saskatchewan Policies including but not limited to, the Code of Conduct and Ethics, Athlete Protection Policy, Social media policy as found in the Swim Sask's Safe Sport manual, which can be found [HERE](#)
- Effective September 1, 2026, Rule C.2.3.2.1 (Misconduct Provisions) will explicitly include misconduct immediately prior to the start of a race such as: (1) deliberate or negligent spitting/spouting water/blowing the nose in the pool or on the pool deck, (2) deliberate kicking or striking of the starting platform (including the back plate), and (3) unsafe or uncontrolled pool entry (all swimmers must enter the pool feet-first with control prior to the start). This update supports public health and facility hygiene standards, helps protect participants and officials, and reduces facility/equipment damage and associated costs.
From now through August 31, 2026, officials will apply an education-first approach – using calm reminders and warnings and penalizing only clear, deliberate acts (not incidental spray, coughing, or normal block foot adjustments). As of September 1, 2026, the rule will be fully enforced, and the Referee may disqualify a swimmer for such misconduct.

- **Meet Management reserves the right to change session start times once entries are received. Coaches will be notified should the session start times change.**

7. Officials

- Officials Registration Deadline: Monday, May 11, 2026
- Register at: www.goldfins.ca
 - Complementary hospitality will be available.
- Anyone attending is encouraged and welcome to register as an official and/or volunteer at this meet.

8. Eligibility:

- **Entries will only be accepted for Masters' swimmers currently registered with a Swimming Canada affiliated club.**
- Masters' swimmers must be a minimum of 18 years of age as of Saturday May 16, 2026. Age as of December 31, 2026 determines age group for results.
- Masters' swimmers that are also classified PARA swimmers who are registered with Swimming Canada, or a World Aquatics affiliate are eligible to compete.
- This meet is a combined Masters and Age Group swim meet
- This is an open invitational meet open to any registered Canadian Masters Swimmer

9. Qualifying Times: - there are NO qualifying times for this meet.

10. Entry Deadline Date:

- **Entries must be received by 9:59 CST on Tuesday, May 5, 2026**
- All Attending coaches must be listed when uploading the entry file.
- **If a coach from the same club as swimmers registered is not attending the meet, the coach must provide the Meet Manager with the name of the coach and club that will be responsible for coaching their swimmers.**

11. Entry Fees:

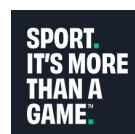
- Masters swimmers meet surcharge: \$40.00.
- **Fees are to be paid via e-transfer the Saskatoon Goldfins Swim Club – payments@goldfins.ca**
 - All entry fees are to be paid by Wednesday, May 13, 2026.
 - No swimmer/team will be allowed to start warm-up until entry fees have been paid.

12. Entries Refund Policy:

- There will be NO refunds.

13. Entry Limit:

- This meet is restricted to 40 Masters swimmers.
- Each Master swimmer is limited to entering four (4) individual events.
- NOTE: The Age Group portion of the meet is limited to 160 age group swimmers
- Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-entered basis, by the date and time the Entry file is received.
- When the meet reaches ~30 entered swimmers, then the next registered team in its entirety will be accepted.

14. Entries

- **All entries must be uploaded to the Swimming Canada Online Entries System.** No entries will be accepted by email.
 - Entry times are to be entered as Short Course Only (SC); converted times will be accepted.
 - Estimated/Custom Times will also be accepted.
 - If a swimmer does not have a time, then they can be entered with either an NT or a custom time.
 - **Masters swimmers are only permitted to enter ONE of events # 1 to 4 (one of either 100 Fly, 100 Back, 100 Breast or 100 Freestyle respectively)**
 - Please contact Jennifer Robinson if you have any further questions regarding entries.

15. Relay Entries:

- There will be no relays offered.

16. Deck Entries:

- Deck entries may be allowed at the discretion of Meet Management and only if space permits; additional heats will not be created.
- **Deck entry fee:** \$15.00 per event.
- Deck entries and fess must be submitted by 8:35 AM.
- Deck entries do not count toward a swimmer's maximum of 4 individual events.
- Deck entries are for additional swims for swimmers that have already entered the competition and have passed registration validation, to swim additional swims in empty lanes. Deck Entries are not for day of competition entries.
- *Please note that deck entries are not for day-of-competition requests.*
- All deck entries will be considered "exhibition" and will not be scored.

17. Meet Format/Competition

- All events will be offered as Timed Finals.
- All Masters events will be offered as Mixed events.
- There are no PARA-specific events or entry standards.

18. Seeding

- Masters' events will be senior seeded. This meet will be seeded slowest to fastest.
- Para swimmers will be seeded according to their entry time.

19. Start

- Starts will be conducted from Starting Platforms (blocks) as per World Aquatic rule II.16.14 and Swimming Canada Rules 4.1
- Starts will be conducted from the Deck or Bulkhead as per Swimming Rule C4.1.1
- In-water starts will also be allowed and will be conducted as per Swimming Canada Rule C4.1.2
- Starting Platforms (blocks) will only be available for events 50m and greater.
- 25m events will start from the 25m bulkhead.
- There will be no backstroke starting ledges available at this swim meet.
- This competition can provide the following accommodation for swimmers who are D/deaf or Hard of hearing:
 - Non-verbal instruction provided by a support person that has a status of "Active" in the Swimming Canada Registration system.

20. Scratch rules

- Scratches simply create empty lanes, as there will be no re-seeding.
- Scratches may be made at any time without penalty except for loss of entry fee.
- Clubs are requested to report any scratches no later than 8:10 AM.

21. Scoring

- There will be no scoring of the Masters' events.

22. Awards

- Awards for Heat Winners and for Personal Bests will be presented throughout the meet.

23. Results

- Official results will be uploaded to the Swimming Canada Online System (REMS) following the completion of the competition.
- Unofficial results will be made available during the event on the Meet Mobile app.
- Results will be published in age groups as specified in the Swimming Canada Masters Rule [C3.1.0](#)

24. Official Splits

- Official split requests must be submitted to Meet Management a minimum of 15 minutes prior to the start of the session.
- The team requesting the official split may be required to provide additional trained timers to help take the official split.

25. Meet Safety Rules

- Lanes will be available for diving and/or pace 15 minutes from the end of the warm-up session.
- There will be separate warm-up lanes for Masters Swimmers and Age Group Swimmers. Meet Management will assign lanes.
- A Para swimming lane may be designated based on coach request. Please contact the Meet Management to make this request.
- The specifics of the lane assignment will be communicated in the Technical Bulletin a minimum of three days prior to the start of the meet.

26. General or Facility Information

- Any changes to the meet format will be shared with the coaches in the Coaches Technical Bulletin that will be emailed to attending coaches prior to the start of the swim meet.
- Glass containers and breakables are not allowed on the pool deck.
- No deck changing will be allowed. Swimmers must use the change rooms. Swimmers who change on deck may be removed from the competition.
- The Goldfins Swim Club will not accept responsibility for lost or stolen items. It is the responsibility of each swimmer entered into the meet to ensure their personal belongings are stored in a secure manner.
- Only swimmers, coaches and officials are allowed on the pool deck. Spectators must remain outside of the pool area or in the upstairs bleachers.

29. Photography/Videography

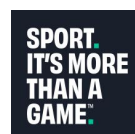
- To minimize risk, all photographs and video taken at Swimming Canada/Swim Saskatchewan sanctioned competitions, whether taken by a professional photographer or videographer, spectator, team support staff or any other participant, must observe generally accepted standards of decency. Under no circumstances are cameras or other recording devices allowed in the area immediately behind the starting blocks during practice or competition starts, or in locker rooms, bathrooms, or any other dressing area.

- Clubs may appoint one official photographer for their club to be granted access to a designated area/working deck. Please contact Meet Manager prior to the competition for permission.
- Meet Management may issue an accreditation/name tag identifying such person.
- If a tag is issued; then it must be worn at all times.

Safe Sport

- Swimming Canada and Swim Saskatchewan believe that athletes, coaches, officials, support staff and volunteers have the right to participate in a safe and inclusive sport environment that is free of abuse, harassment, and discrimination.
- All interactions between an athlete and an individual who is in a position of trust should normally, and wherever possible, be in an environment that is both “open” and “observable” to others.

- Only participating swimmers, officials, registered coaches, and authorized people are allowed on deck.

Swimwear

- All swimmers are permitted to race with the swimwear of their choosing at all competitions sanctioned by Swim Saskatchewan. It is not required to declare the choice of swimwear to the Referee, if the fabric of the swimwear is a permeable open mesh textile and would not reasonably be seen to create a technical advantage in terms of speed, buoyancy, or endurance.
